U.S. Soccer Federation and US Club Soccer Launch New Shared Services Partnership
New Partnership is Part of U.S. Soccer's Pathways Strategy to Create a More Unified, Player-Focused and Affordable Soccer Ecosystem

The U.S. Soccer Federation today announced that it has entered into a new strategic relationship with US Club Soccer as part of the organization's ongoing Pathways Strategy to make soccer more affordable, drive higher participation and produce more world-class players for its national teams. Under the terms of this managed services agreement (MSA), leading global sports, music, and entertainment company Wasserman, who previously managed US Club Soccer's internal operations, will enter into a new strategic partnership with US Soccer and U.S. Soccer will take over operational shared services of US Club Soccer's internal operations from Wasserman.

As part of this new agreement, U.S. Soccer will support US Club Soccer's core back-end operations, including HR, IT, and finance. This approach enables both organizations to focus on better support to clubs and leagues, participation growth, and affordability across the ecosystem. This management services agreement also reflects U.S. Soccer's commitment to building a system that works better for everyone in the soccer ecosystem and marks a natural next step in U.S. Soccer's broader Pathways Strategy.

Pathways is focused on three goals: lowering the cost of running soccer programs so more people can participate affordably; growing access and opportunity across all levels of the game; and improving the experience for players, coaches, parents, referees, leagues, and clubs to provide better, more accessible developmental opportunities.

"Our focus at U.S. Soccer has never been clearer - we exist in service to every player, coach, and referee in this country. And we know that people are seeking a youth soccer system that is more aligned, more transparent, more affordable, and easier to navigate," said Dan Helfrich, Chief Operating Officer at the U.S. Soccer Federation. "This relationship with US Club Soccer is a critical first step toward making this happen, as they are a critical connector of clubs and leagues across the country. We will continue to pursue additional ways to accelerate our Pathways strategy and bring the US Way to life."

"This is a momentous time for our organization and the sport," said Mike Cullina, CEO of US Club Soccer. "We've often told our staff, board and league partners: 'If it's good for soccer, it's good for US Club Soccer.' The order of that statement is intentional; we've always considered ourselves as serving the sport first, trusting that by doing so – even structuring ourselves as such – that our organization will grow. This is a huge step forward in unifying soccer, and we appreciate the trust placed in the US Club Soccer team to serve the sport."

Cullina is helping to lead the transition and will remain as CEO of US Club Soccer. For US Club Soccer staff, its thousands of clubs and leagues, and more than 800,000 annual participants nationwide, operations remain the same, with the added benefit of more direct access to U.S. Soccer's systems, expertise, and support. U.S. Soccer is also engaging with other National Associations and members to explore managed services agreements and related areas of collaboration. These discussions are focused on improving coordination and supporting a more connected competitive environment aligned with the Pathways Strategy. U.S. Soccer will actively work with members interested in this new partnership model in the future.

DYSA State Cup and President's Cup Events

Registration is now open for the Delaware State Cup and President's Cup. Details are below:

DELAWARE STATE CUP (U11 and U12 Age Groups Only)

Maryland will be hosting a U11 and U12 Age Group regional event for the winners from each state's State Cup. In Delaware we will follow the same format that we have done before. Teams will register for the State Cup event. If we have more than one team registered for the event then we will either have a game or group play, depending on the number of teams registered. Team registering for the U11-U12 Delaware State Cup that either win their age group or are the only team registered will be required to attend the Regional event. The regional event information is below. The registration deadline will be March 11, 2026.

DELAWARE STATE CUP (U13-U19 Age Groups)

Fee: There are no fees to enter at the state level. In Delaware we will follow the same format that we have done before. Should there be more than one team in an age group, teams will self schedule games to determine a state champion. Games must be completed by April 1. Teams are responsible for ref fees, ref assigning fees and field fees at the state level. The team that is crowned the state champ will advance to the appropriate regional event and will be responsible for the entry fee and any other fees associated with the event.

PRESIDENT'S CUP (U13-19 Age Groups)

Founded in 2008, Presidents Cup is US Youth Soccer's second-tier national competition. The Presidents Cup highlights competition, camaraderie, and community among participating teams. In Delaware we will follow the same format that we have done before. Should there be more than one team in an age group, teams will self schedule games to determine a state champion. Games must be completed by April 1. Teams are responsible for ref fees, ref assigning fees and field fees at the state level. The team that is crowned the state champ will advance to the appropriate regional event and will be responsible for the entry fee and any other fees associated with the event.

TEAMS MAY ONLY PARTICIPATE IN ONE EVENT AT THE STATE LEVEL.

Note to Delaware ODP Players:

We will continue to closely monitor ODP player performances through ongoing scouting efforts and regular communication with club coaches and contacts. Please remain focused, committed to your training, and physically prepared in the coming months so you are ready to perform at your best should you be selected to represent Delaware at the East Region Tournament.

ODP Process, 2025-2026 Campaign Summary:

The Delaware ODP Program is for Under-12 to Under-18 players, and the first step is to attend tryouts in August. Then for the player to be selected at tryouts or get recommended and be selected to our Delaware ODP Player Pool Winter Camp.

Winter Camp is used to identify the best players in the Delaware State Player Pool to then select to represent Delaware in the East Region Tournament in June 2026. Our Delaware state teams have been very successful in competing with the other states in the East Region, and we have had a strong number of players selected to the next phase of ODP.

The East Region Tournament is used by the East Region staff to identify and select players to the East Region Summer ID Event Pool Camp (top players in East Region) in July 2026.

The East Region Summer ID Event Pool Camp, July 2026, is used to pick the top 18 players to represent the East Region in the Interregional Event in January 2027 competing against the other regional teams.

The Interregional Event is used by the USYS ODP National Team staff to identify the best players from the Regional Teams to be selected to the USYS ODP National Team which will attend an event (domestic or international) the following Summer in 2027.
